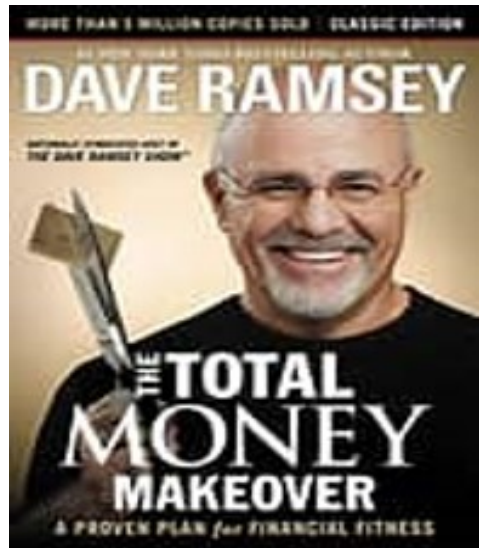

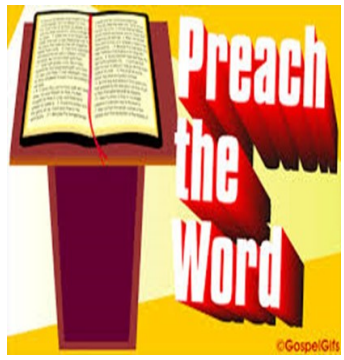

The church is a channel to be used by God to help individuals manage their mental illness, or emotional instability as we usher them closer to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. It is imperative that we eradicate the silence, shame and stigma around Mental health. We must realize that It is through the myths that we can bring more pain to those who are in need of compassion, love, support and intervention.

There are several myths that we often hear from those in the church. First that mental illness is not an illness and that it is the result of a person's sin nature, lack of prayer or faith. Secondly, the myth that people do not need medication because they are not ill. The church should not treat Individuals with mental illness any differently than those who are experiencing physical illness. The process of providing support should be at the same level.

The church of today should never over spiritualize mental health. We must provide a holistic ministry to address the total person: body, mind, spirit and soul so that a solid relationship can be built with Christ and others. We should walk with individuals who maybe depressed, suffer from anxiety, trauma, fears, toxic relationships or any mental health or emotional issue that may be affecting their ability to function and live a more productive life.

We as the people of God must demonstrate Jesus' love and compassion to all people. We must begin to listen attentively without always giving advice. The church is one place where people need to feel safe and cared for. Jesus is the ultimate healer, but He has chosen counselors, therapists and pastors to guide people through their brokenness. Dr. Rob Reimer stated that, "Self-awareness is a gateway to life changes...We cannot heal that which we will not admit... God cannot cleanse that which we will not confess." Counselors, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, can help individuals uncover their deepest pain so that they can be made whole. God wants to heal broken hearts, which allows a person to truly experience a newness of life.
