Message from the Pastor

Grace, mercy and peace be unto you from God our Father and Jesus our Lord and Savior.

I greet you with the joy of Jesus as we celebrate another month. November has arrived with leaves falling, temperatures cooling, and families preparing to spend time together celebrating holidays.

While we know November as the 11th month of the calendar year, it didn't start that way. November derives from the Latin root *novem*- meaning "nine," because in the Roman calendar there were only 10 months in the year, and November was indeed the ninth month. The word *November* was first recorded before the year 1000. November retained its name (from the Latin *novem* meaning "nine") when January and February were added to the Roman calendar. November for us is also a time of preparation.

Harvest has been gathered to store for the winter months that we might have all needed to sustain during winter. It is a time of Thanksgiving, thanking God for all

He has done and provided. The seed was planted, the rains watered, and God brought increase, thus we praise God for the provisions. his verse says that it's God's will for everyone who believes in Jesus to be thankful. There are some things that happen in our lives that we are truly thankful for. We are thankful for birthdays, weddings, love, and family. But some things that happen are really difficult. We might have an illness, the death of a loved one, divorce, or some other sad event.

How can God expect us to be grateful for those things? Let's look really closely at our verse. Some might think that this verse says to be thankful FOR all of our circumstances. But the verse actually says to be thankful in all circumstances. The original Hebrew word for IN that is used here means "in the middle of" or "during." In other words, no matter what is happening in your life, you can be thankful. The Bible says that being thankful brings honor to God (psalm 50:23). In the Old Testament, there were certain sacrifices that the people were instructed to make as thank offerings to the Lord. When we thank God, we acknowledge that He deserves the credit. He has done for us what we could not do for ourselves.

When others see you thank God, you point them to Him. Giving thanks also helps us because it makes us focus our attention on God. What do you have to be thankful for? Now is a good time to access your life or take an inventory of all God has blessed you with. You will probably discover that His blessings are too many to count and or name. Just remember to that Him IN all things. There is no situation we face that God leaves or abandons us; therefore, we owe him thanks in everything.

I close with verses 4 and 5 of Psalm 100. These verses convey a very important command. "Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise, be thankful unto him, and bless his name. For the Lord is good, His mercy is everlasting, and His truth endureth to all generations." May God continue to richly bless you.


